

IMPERIAL HOTEL TOKYO

Walking distance to Tokyo Station and Ginza, the Imperial Hotel is the Grand Dame of Tokyo hotels. Built in 1890, rebuilt in 1923 by Frank Lloyd Wright, and completely changed again in 1967, the Imperial has endured fires, earthquakes, and bombings while still retaining its sense of aristocracy and refinement. Boasting a gorgeous indoor pool, a state-of-the-art gym, and 13 wildly popular restaurants, the Imperial does not disappoint. When choosing your guest room or suite, you may want to opt for one of the Imperial's "Tower" rooms for incredible views of the Tokyo skyline. And for a uniquely Japanese experience, reserve your time at the Imperial's "Toko-An" for a private tea ceremony you won't soon forget.
